Tsunamis Facts

- Tsunamis can form after an earthquake
- Can travel 20-30 miles per hour
- Waves can range from 10-100 feet in height

Signs of a potential Tsunami

- Sudden draining of water showing ocean floor
- Roaring noise coming from the ocean
- Unusual ocean behavior

During a Tsunami Warning

- Move to higher ground or as far inland as possible
- Follow evacuation routes.

Evacuation Plans

- Know your Tsunami evacuation routes
- Practice your family evacuation plan
- Sign up for <u>NotifyLA</u> for emergency alerts

After a Tsunami

- Listen to local alerts and authorities
 on area to avoid
- Be aware of the risk of electrocution
- Save phone calls for emergencies (use text messaging to communicate with friends or family)



DON'T FIGHT THE FLOOD - PREPARE FOR IT!

BEFORE

- VISIT FEMA'S <u>FLOOD MAP</u> <u>SERVICE CENTER</u> TO KNOW TYPES OF FLOOD RISK IN YOUR AREA
- SIGN UP THE CITY OF L.A.'S WARNING SYSTEM AT NOTIFYLA.ORG
- GET FLOOD COVERAGE UNDER THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM (NFIP)
- LEARN AND PRACTICE EVACUATION ROUTES, SHELTER PLANS, AND FLASH FLOOD RESPONSE
- KEEP IMPORTANT
 DOCUMENTS IN A
 WATERPROOF CONTAINER
- KEEP YOUR EVACUATION KIT UP TO DATE!

DURING

- EVACUATE IMMEDIATELY AFTER BEING TOLD
- LISTEN TO LOCAL ALERTING SYSTEMS FOR CURRENT EMERGENCY INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS
- DO NOT WALK, SWIM OR DRIVE THROUGH FLOOD WATERS. TURN AROUND. DON'T DROWN!
- STAY OFF OF BRIDGES OVER FAST-MOVING WATER
- IF TRAPPED IN YOUR CAR IN RAPIDLY MOVING WATER, STAY INSIDE -- GET ON THE ROOF IF WATER IS RISING INSIDE THE CAR
- IF TRAPPED IN A BUILDING,
 GET TO THE HIGHEST LEVEL
 ONLY GET ON THE ROOF IF
 NECESSARY

AFTER

- PAY ATTENTION TO AUTHORITIES FOR INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS.
- AVOID DRIVING EXCEPT IN EMERGENCIES
- WEAR HEAVY WORK
 GLOVES, PROTECTIVE
 CLOTHING AND BOOTS
 DURING CLEAN UP AND USE
 APPROPRIATE FACE
 COVERINGS OR MASKS
- DO NOT TOUCH ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT IF IT IS WET OR IF YOU ARE STANDING IN WATER. TURN OFF THE ELECTRICITY TO PREVENT ELECTRIC SHOCK IF IT IS SAFE TO DO SO
- AVOID WADING IN FLOODWATER
